Revolutionizing Waste Management Practices

In the past few months, the organization has recycled over 300,000 kgs of waste, ranging from E-waste to metal waste. This waste was

largely collected through drives at corporate offices. One of the key verticals of the organization is helping trash pickers around the city.

To help trash pickers stay safe, Civitas is providing health and safety kits funded by a portion of their funds to over 100 workers. They are also targeting residential Hyderabad by implementing waste segregation bins for E-waste and fabric waste across over 30 communities while providing better waste disposal facilities and educating residents on waste management practices.

104° viral fever didn't deter Lakshita from writing exam

Hyderabad: Lakshita Vempati was down with a very high (104°F) viral fever just before her exams, forcing her hospitalisation. But, Lakshita didn't lose her focus and resolve. She scored 585 out of 600 (97.5%) in class 10 board examinations.

The 15-year-old had to go for exams directly from the hospital and was hooked to IV fluids even during the examination. "I was not ready to wait to appear for the board exams. So, I had decided to go ahead even if it meant that I had to go to the exam centre directly from the hospital bed," Lakshita of P Obul Reddy Public School told TOI.

She recalled that even after reaching the exam centre, she was feeling dizzy because of high fever. "Once the ques-

tion paper was given, I did not feel anything. I love to write and was enthusiastic about exams. May be, that is why I did not face any problems while writing the exam," she said. Lakshita was a topper of her school in both the pre-board exams.

Lakshita's mother Annapurna said that almost eve-

ryone in the family had Covid-19 about 15-20 days before the exams.

"My daughter fell sick again two days before the exam. Her situation was so bad that we had to admit her a day before the exam," said Annapurna, adding that she was discharged only after the second exam.

Annapurna said she helped Lakshita to revise by explaining a few topics. The young girl was mostly dependent on YouTube videos to revise. She said her daughter's school helped to get permission from the exam centre to appear for the exam and ensured that all precautions were taken so that other students at the centre were not infected. A resident of Manikonda, Lakshita said that she wants to follow in her father's footsteps and become a doctor.

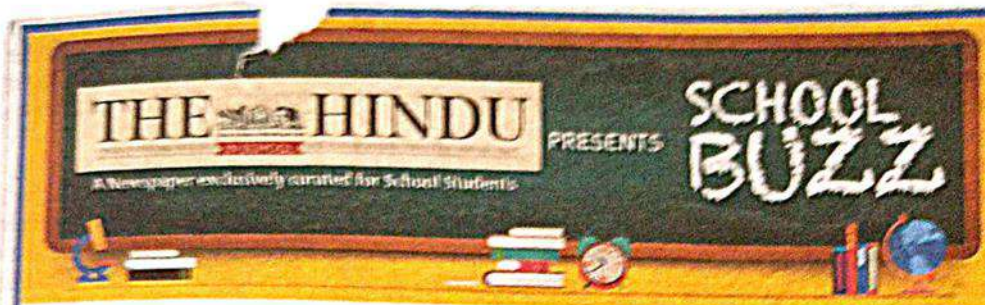

STUDENT LED CONFERENCE

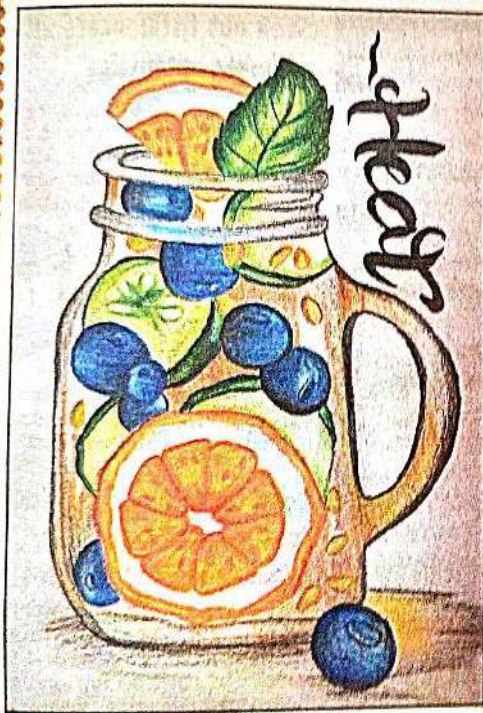

Before the mosquitoes enter our pillows.

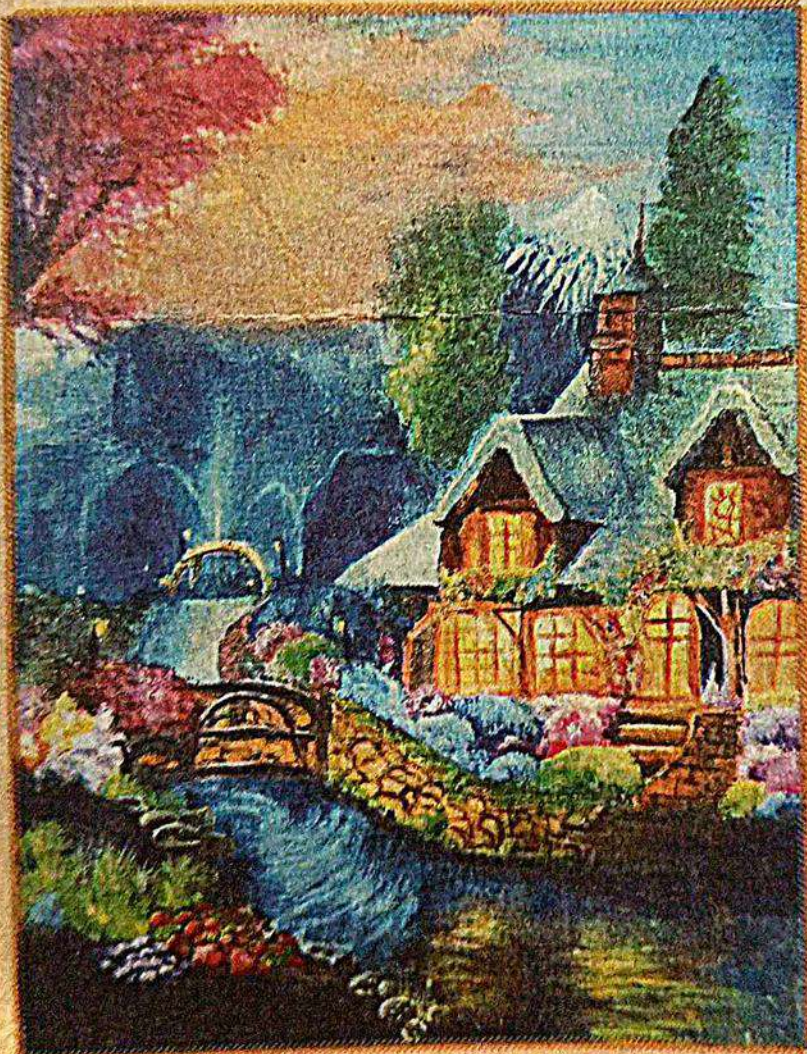
It's time for me to sleep,

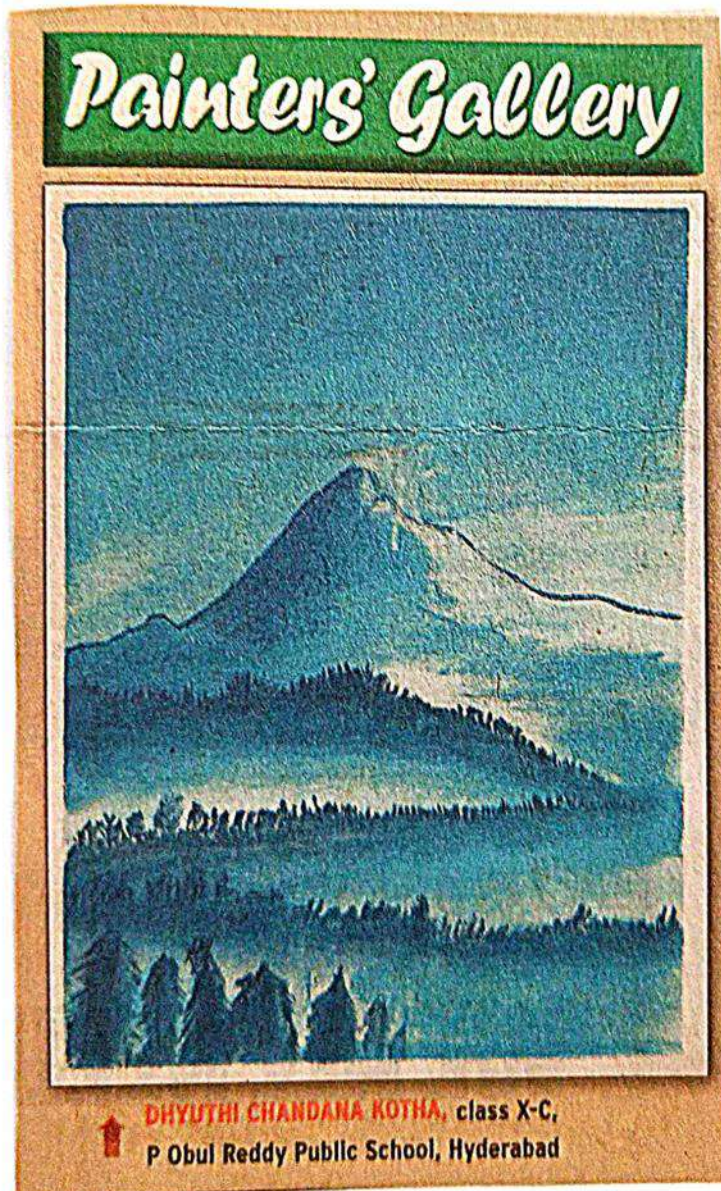

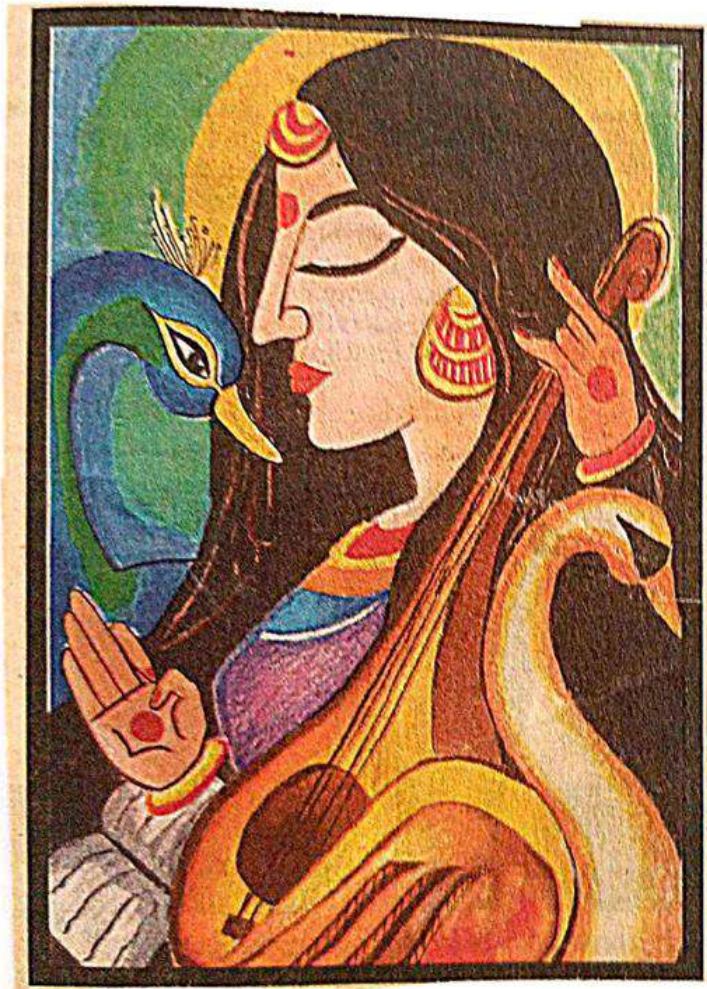

BRONZE FOR VRITTI

Maana leads as 4 records sink at swimming nationals

HYDERABAD, JULY 2

Vritti Agarwal of Maharashtra clinched a bronze medal in the women's 400 metres freestyle event at the 76th Senior National Aquatic Championship being held at the GMC Balayogi Stadium in Gachibowli, Hyderabad on Sunday.

The city girl clocked 4:28.65 to finish third while Bhavya Sachdeva of Delhi tagged top honours with the timing of 4:28.65. Aanya Wala of Maharashtra clocked 4:33.33 to take silver.

Four national records were rewritten, including one by Olympian Maana Patel who bettered her own mark.

Maana, the only woman swimmer to represent India at the Tokyo Olympics, improved her own national record of 2:39.38 in the women's 200m breaststroke events by clocking 1:03.48.

Maharashtra's Palak Joshi (1:04.32) and Karnataka's Suvana C. Baskar (1:05.09) finished second and third respectively.

Among others who created new national marks were Gujarat's Aryan Nehra and Karnataka swimmers Nina Venkatesh and Lineysha K. Aryan, who has already sealed a berth for the Asian Games and World Championships in

the men's 800m and 1500m freestyle, clinched the gold medal in the men's 400m freestyle event, setting a new national record with a timing of 3:52.55.

The earlier record was held by Delhi's Kushagra Rawat who came in second, clocking 3:55.45.

The two swimmers were neck and neck for the most part of the race but Aryan did well to accelerate, moving ahead in the final 100m. Karnataka's Aneesh S. Gowda came in third

with a timing of 3:57.86.

Nina had a splendid day in the pool. The Karnataka swimmer broke the national record twice in the women's 50m butterfly. First, she clocked 28.01s in the heats to erase Divya Satija's record 28.33 set in 2019. She then bettered that mark by clocking 27.74s in the final.

Nina's state-mate Lineysha clocked 2:37.35 which was over 2 seconds faster than her earlier

national record of 2:39.38 in the women's 200m breaststroke.

Such was Lineysha's dominance that her state-mate — S. Lakshya, who came in second was close to two seconds behind her with a timing of 2:41.13.

Gujarat's Venika Parikh, who clocked 2:43.41s was the third swimmer on the podium.

Guangzhou Asian Games bronze medallist Virdhawal Khade also stood on the podium on

the opening day.

The 31-year-old seasoned swimmer clinched the gold in the men's 50m butterfly. He clocked 24.33s, edging out Tamil Nadu's Benedicton Rohit B (24.62) and Maharashtra's Mihir Ambre (24.78).

Bronze No. 2 for Vritti

Telangana swimmer bags another medal at Nationals

HYDERABAD, JULY 3

Telangana girl Vritti Agarwal bagged another bronze medal at the 76th Senior National Aquatic Championship being held at the GMC Balayogi stadium here on Monday. She finished third on the podium in the women's 800 meters freestyle event with the timings of 18:09:50. Delhi's Bhavya Sachdeva clocked 17:51:12 to emerge on top while Richa Mishra (AIPSCB) finished second, with the timings of 18:04:32.

On Sunday, Vritti clinched bronze in the women's 400m freestyle event.

Meanwhile, Asian Games-bound swimmer Aryan Nehra broke yet another national record en route to his gold-winning performance in the men's 800m freestyle event. Nehra breached the Asian Games qualifying standard for the second time in his career by clocking 8:03.15.

In a repeat of Sunday's 800m freestyle event, Nehra once again got the better of national record holder Delhi's Kushagra Rawat, who clinched a silver with a timing of 8:25, while Karnataka swimmer Aneesh Gowda came third. The Gujarat swimmer booked his place in the continental event in

April during a meet in Chicago where he swam a personal best of 8:03.15 in the 800m freestyle event.

He has also breached the 1500m freestyle qualification time.

The Swimming Federation of India has set the 2018 Asian Games sixth place time as the qualifying mark for this year's edition, set to take place in Hangzhou, China in September.

The qualification period

for the Asian Games ends on July 6.

Karnataka's Harshika Ramachandra and Maharashtra swimmer Anannya Nayak also rewrote national marks in the women's 200m medley and 100m freestyle events respectively.

Harshika, who clocked 2:21.15, bettered seasoned swimmer Richa Mishra's 13-year-old record of 2:23.62.

Anannya, on the other

hand, stopped the clock at 57.31s toppling Shivangi Sharma's national record of 57.73s set last year.

Principals split on CBSE regional language move

CBSE Students Can Now Study In 22 Languages

Hyderabad: The Central Board of Secondary Education's (CBSE) move to introduce 22 languages, including Telugu, as mediums of instruction has evoked mixed responses among school principals in Hyderabad.

While some feel that students might sign up to study a subject or two in their preferred language — even though the schools might not entirely change their medium of instruction — others aren't sure it will find many takers, especially in urban pockets.

"There is a possibility of clusters being formed, based on demand, to teach a subject in Telugu, Tamil, Punjabi or any other Indian language," said Simi Nagi, principal, Pallavi Model School. Explaining how some students understand a subject better when it is taught in their mother tongue, as they are familiar with the words and content, she added: "Many students, for instance, struggle with social studies since they know they don't need it after class 10. So, I feel this move will be beneficial for subjects like that."

Some other principals **TOI** spoke to said that Telugu medium schools with CBSE curriculum might come up in villages.

"In places where there is a shortage of teachers to teach in English medium, managements might prefer Telugu medium as there is a huge demand for CBSE curriculum everywhere. The same goes for government schools, if the state decides to start. But, in a place like Hyderabad or any other urban area, I don't know if there will be any ta-

Rural students can excel, say teachers

Hyderabad: Writing exams in their mother tongue could help some students score better marks, feel teachers and principals.

"Many students, especially those from north India, write their social exam in Hindi here in Hyderabad as they find it very difficult to write in English. It is very common in Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs). The option to write in Hindi, for English medium students, is available for subjects like science and maths as well," said E Krishna Murthy, a retired principal of a KV in the city.

He said this option is not just limited to government schools as private school students too can take their exams in Hindi, which might now be

extended to other languages as well. "Some students might benefit from it. But unless someone is very comfortable writing in Telugu, they would want to continue with English," he said. Teachers also pointed out how more students might be willing to study in Telugu or Urdu in rural areas. "Many in rural areas want to study in the CBSE curriculum but are unable to because of the language barrier. Now, such students will get an opportunity to excel," said B Shivaraj, a teacher working in a private school in the city.

They said as students tend to express better in their mother tongue than in English, they will have a better chance of scoring more marks. **TNN**

kers for Telugu medium," said S Narsimha Reddy, principal, Hyderabad Public School, Ramanthapur. He pointed out that unless a student has command over different languages, it is going to be diffi-

cult to study and write exams of some subjects in one language and others in a different language. A few also pointed out how multilingualism might sound good on paper, but it is not feasible.

TRIBUTES PAID TO KARGIL WARRIORS

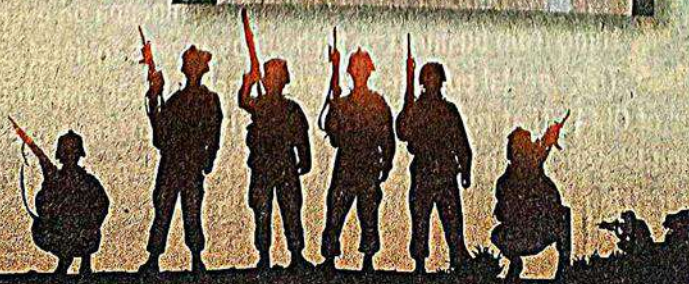
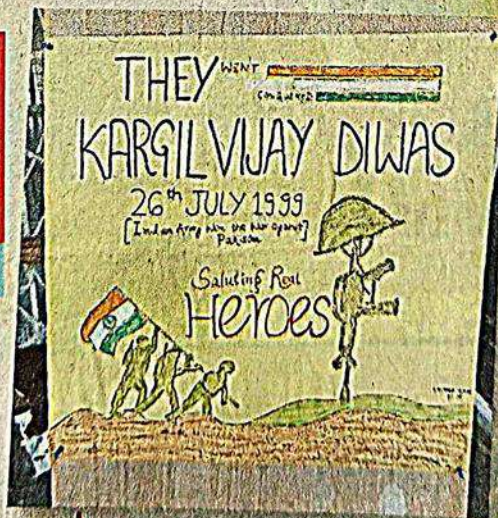

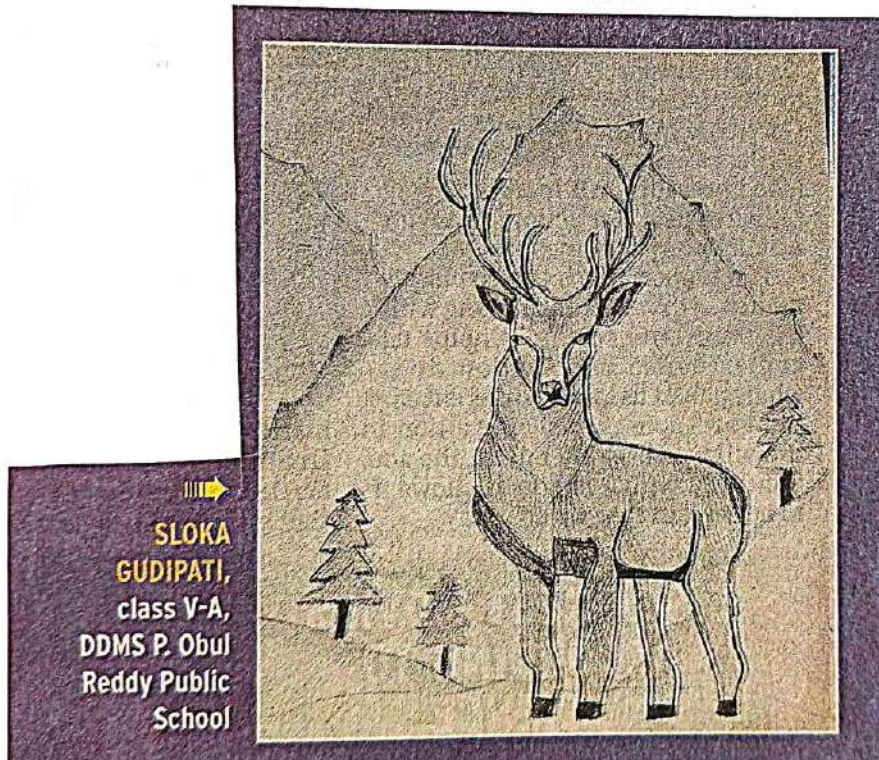
In fact, the entire week beginning from 24th July to 28th July was dedicated to this activity. The management, principal and other staff too paid their tributes to the warriors on this day.

Prizes were distributed to all the winners. Children were very excited to see their grandparents participate in the games and cheered them



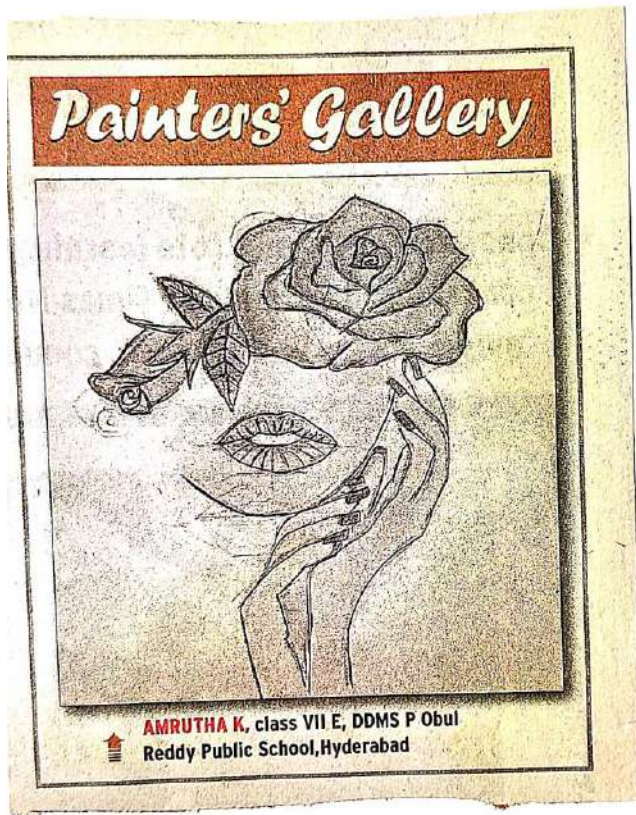

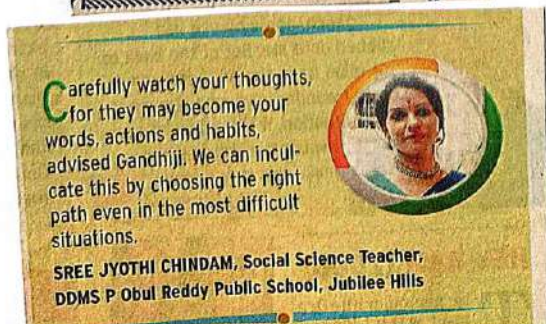

'Class X, XII board exams twice a year won't be mandatory'

Appearing for class X and XII board exams twice a year will not be mandatory for students and the option is being introduced to reduce stress caused by the fear of single opportunity, Union education minister Dharmendra Pradhan has said. "The students will have the option of appearing for the (class X and XII board) exams

twice a year just like engineering entrance exam JEE. They can choose the best score... but it will be completely optional," he said.

"If any student feels that he is completely prepared and is satisfied with the score in the first set of exams, he can choose not to appear for the next exams. Nothing will be mandatory," he added.

According to the New Curriculum Framework (NCF) announced by the ministry of education in August, Board examinations will be held twice a year to ensure that students have enough time and opportunity to perform well and get an option to retain the best score.

NCERT panel approves proposal to replace India with Bharat in textbooks

In a significant development, the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) panel has approved a proposal to change the way India is referred to in school textbooks. The proposal suggests replacing 'India' with 'Bharat.' The panel has recommended the adoption of 'classical history' nomenclature, replacing 'ancient history' in textbooks. According to the committee chairperson C I Isaac, the panel has suggested replacing the name "India" with "Bharat" in the textbooks, introducing "classical history" instead of "ancient history" in the curriculum and including the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) in the syllabus for all subjects.

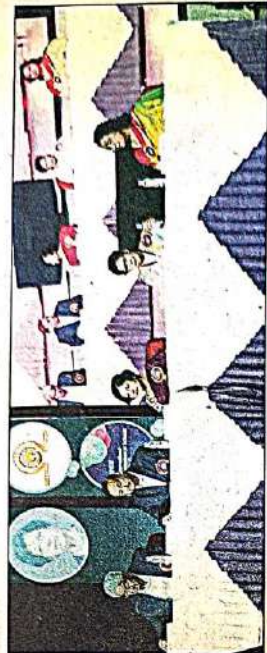

Candidates with more than five subjects may have the best five subjects determined by admitting institutes or employers recruiting CBSE board students. In a notice on its website, on November 30, the CBSE said that it is receiving requests from various persons to intimate the criteria to calculate the percentage of the students in the Board's exams. However, the sub-section 40.1 (iii) of Chapter - 7 of the examination by-laws state that "No overall division/distinction/aggregate shall be awarded."
