FROM THE DESK OF UKG TEACHERS;

We are going to tell you about the early programme lesson on Tell Me a Story.

In this lesson, students will learn that stories inform us about how things happen and how things work.

They will listen to four Aesop's fables. The students will predict what will happen, experiment to see what happens and review their predictions.

During Math's time, students will learn to put together and break apart the numbers 16 to 20 using the 10 frames. Students will also learn and write number names.

During Language time, students will retell a story every day. They will explore what the story is about and where is it happening, and will put the picture cards in the correct order. Students will also draw parts of the story they liked and tell them using key words from the story. Students will also identify, learn and write animal names.

Children would be able to learn and write letters in **2nd language**.

Rather than just listening to and retelling stories, students will predict, observe or conduct an experiment and then stick to or change their prediction accordingly.

At home, you can read bedtimes stories to your child every day. Look for words that are commonly used in most of the stories. Use the words to talk about everyday things and events

It would be great if your child can use the new words to retell the story and then use the in other sentences.
