Key outcomes of the workshop are -

- * New tools and techniques to boost attention, participation and retention among young learners . We were introduced to a range of hands-on activities and games that can be easily adapted to any classroom setting. For example: Doha Antakshari
- * How to bring joy and learning in the classroom with rhymes and songs. Ms. Chhabra demonstrated how can simple, **catchy Hindi rhymes** when acted out with expressions and gestures, can help students grasp complex grammar concepts like gender and verb forms effortlessly.
- * Give priority to story telling and importance of Book reading - She performed a lively narration of a folk tale, using intonation, facial expressions, and role-play, showing how storytelling can captivate attention and deliver moral lessons subtly. The importance of reading aloud from age-appropriate books was also highlighted. She shared tips on selecting culturally relevant stories that resonate with young learners and foster a love for reading.

The workshop was not just a professional development session— it was an inspiration to rethink how we approach language teaching. It reminded us that **learning thrives in an environment of joy, curiosity, and connection**. With these renewed creative methodologies we can create richer and more meaningful language learning experience for the students.
